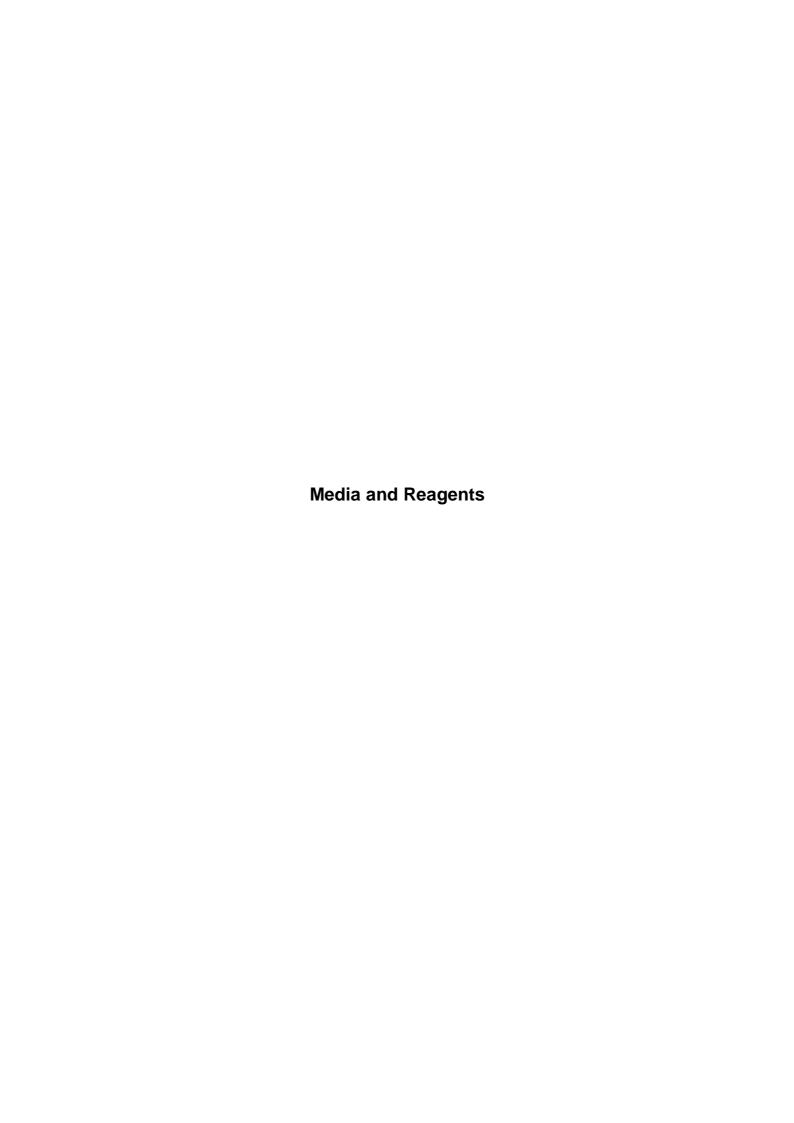

## **FAME Analysis**

#### grams/ml

1. Reagent A - Saponification Reagent

Sodium hydroxide (certified ACS) 45

Methanol (HPLC grade) 150

Deionized distilled water 150

Combine water and methanol. Add NaOH pellets to the solution while stirring. Stir until the pellets dissolve.

2. Reagent B - Methylation Reagent

6.00N Hydrochloric Acid 325

Methanol (HPLC grade) 275

Add acid to methanol while stirring.

3. Reagent C - Extraction Solvent

Hexane (HPLC Grade) 200

Methyl tert-butyl ether (HPLC Grade) 200

Add the MTBE to the hexane and stir well.

4. Reagent D - Base Wash

Sodium hydroxide (certified ACS) 10.8

Deionized distilled water 900

Add NaOH pellets to the water while stirring. Stir until the pellets are dissolved.

### **Phosphates**

1. Reagent A

Ammonium molybdate solution:

15g of reagent grade ammonium paramolybdate dissolved in 500ml deionized water.

### 2. Reagent B

Sulphuric acid solution: (4.5M)

250 ml of Conc. Sulphuric acid added into 750 ml deionized water.

#### 3. Reagent C

Potassium antimonyl tartarate solution:

0.34g of potassium antimonyl tartarate in 250ml deionized water.

### 4. Reagent D

Ascorbic acid solution:

27g ascorbic acid in 500ml deionized water.

#### 5. Mixed reagent:

Mix together 100ml ammonium molybdate solution, 250ml sulphuric acid solution, 50ml potassium antimonyl tartarate.

#### **Nitrate**

#### 1. Reagent A

N (1-napthyl ethylenediamine dihydrochloride):

0.5g of amine in 500ml distilled water.

#### 2. Reagent B

Sulphanilamide solution:

Dissolve 10g sulphanilamide in a mixture of 100ml conc. HCl and 500 ml distilled water. Make up the volume to 1000ml with distilled water.

### 3. Reagent C

Conc. Ammonium chloride solution: Dissolve 125g of AR quality ammonium chloride in 500ml of distilled water.

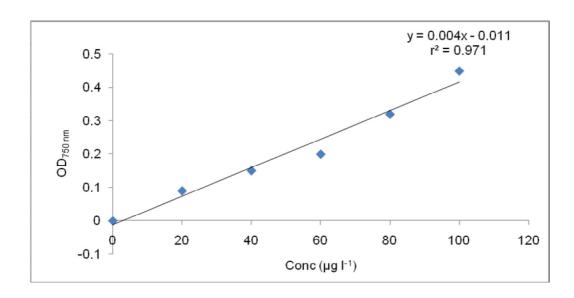
#### 4. Reagent D

Mercuric chloride solution: Prepare 1% mercuric chloride solution by dissolving 1g of  $HgCl_2$  in 100ml distilled water.

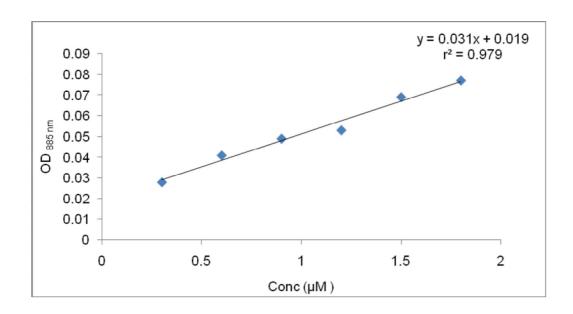


### **Standard Curve**

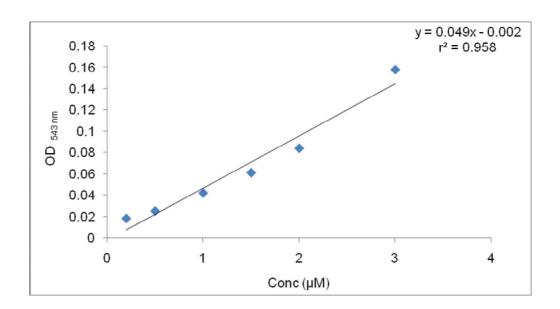

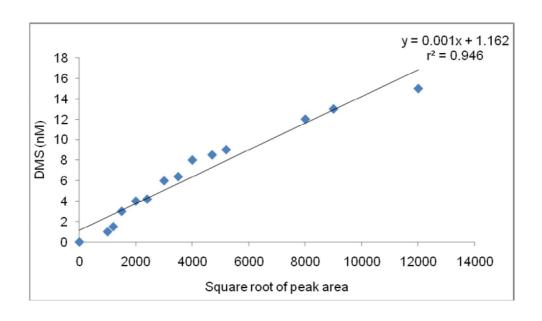
# **Phosphate**



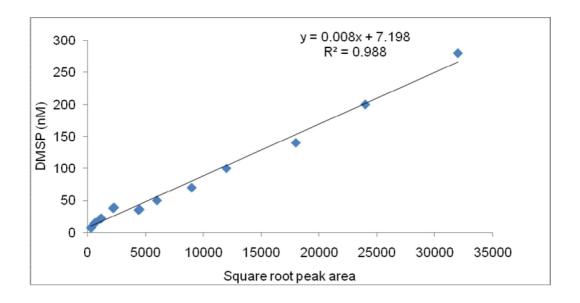
